New process adds a dimension

If it would you like a scene of the San Francisco Bay with the Golden Gate in your living room? Or perhaps a panorama of Vail, Colo., to grace your dining room?

Until now the chances of having either for interior design would be limited to rather unattractive photographic two-dimensional prints.

All that is being changed by the 3M Company, which is marketing a system which would allow you to have a particular scene displayed on the wall or ceiling in the form of a photograph with a three-dimensional effect.

You can now give your own San Francisco Bay room or a beach in the Caribbean wherever you desire. As long as it has been photographed, it can be done.

The firm says its products architectural paintings and they are priced by the square foot. A photographic transparency mounted by a special adhesive system, the product is activated by a computerized system which projects light onto the paper or fabric of the scene.

The process produces paintings on any scale required. Unlike most two-dimensional photographs, they do not suffer from the effects of enlarged grain. In fact, according to the company, the greater the enlargement the better the resolution.

These architectural paintings are more likely to be used for common all-day use than for drawing rooms—no matter how good last year's holiday snaps were. They have already been used at exhibitions including one in Williamsburg.

In the future one can imagine designers arranging for us to walk into a Roman temple, the studio of a famous painter or even into the realm of a wizard—a dozen of the liquidation.

This interesting information came to my attention not through sources in the country, but through the London Telegraph. And I must add that the British interior designers were lamenting the fact that it was available only in America and not in Britain—then it was in the future.

Question: I have French doors in my bedroom leading to a porch. The doors are frequently open. I've looked through many books on window treatments, but none of them really solve the French door problem. I want to have light and be able to see out but still have privacy.

Answer: To solve the French door problem is usually glassed over. If the doors are windows I'd consider...
 One is to use two sets of layered blinds on each door, painted the same color as the doors. This would enable you to open the blinds to see out and have privacy when the blinds are closed. The other is to use a set of opaque, white linen-type fabric panels hung from the middle of the doors.
 With either treatment I would use draperies in addition. They will be hung to wear the doors, but when drawn closed would provide a soft, dramatic effect.


The Lord loved children
