Film buffs offered cinema classes

Persons who are drawn about the film world and who find themselves staying up to watch the late late show can get an insight background by enrolling in one of the film courses being offered at the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College this winter.

Introduction to film, a three-credit course being taught by Dr. Dan Greenberg will involve students in discussion of feature-length films viewed in class. Greenberg will lecture about general principles of film history and appreciation. Among the 15 shorts and feature films to be shown are: King Kong, Pledge Down to Earth, the first Fred Astaire and Rogers musical, Humphrey Bogart in Marlene Dietrich's Brattice Bard and Jack Palance in Gettysburg and Marlene Dietrich in The Blue Angel.

Introduction to Film is a daily devotional course and students may elect it as a choice Theater 100 or Humanities 100. The course is available on an audit basis. Several cinematography courses will be taught during the winter semester which begins Jan. 12. Fundamentals of Cinematography will give students the opportunity to script, shoot and edit both film and Super 8mm film and the extensive list of equipment available at the campus.

Advanced cinematography will allow the students working as a production group to produce to commercial standards a film special sound film as well as continuing their individual productions.

Both these courses are four credits and require a \$19 lab fee. Fundamentals will be taught either from 7:10 p.m. Mondays or from 14 p.m. Wednesdays while advanced cinematography will be taught from 7:10 p.m. Thursdays.

Introduction to Film will be from 14 p.m. Mondays from 14 p.m. or 7:10 p.m. Tuesdays from 2:10 p.m. Wednesdays and from 12:30 p.m. Thursdays.

Houttekier chosen for Washington duty

Francis Houttekier, 3117 Glenmer Farmington Hills, has been chosen to participate in the 1977 Washington Workshop Congressional Seminar in Washington, D.C.

The seminars are conducted by the Washington Workshops Foundation, a nonprofit organization established Nov. 24 of last year. The seminar has been attended by thousands of students since its inception.

The seminars provide students the opportunity to study American government. Houttekier will travel to Capitol Hill where he will confer with government leaders. In conversation with members of Congress, Supreme Court Justices, Cabinet members and other officials, students will hear about the operation of government and submit questions and comments to the speakers.

The students also will spend time observing the workings of the national government first hand as they attend sessions of the House and Senate as well as committee hearings and meet individually with congressmen and senators.

Each seminar features a student-run seminar at which students present resolutions on national priority issues using Congressional research sources as back ground. In the model Congressional session debate follows the rules of the House of Representatives.
