



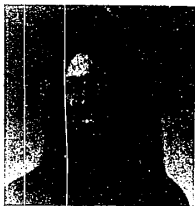
**McKelvey-Kramer**

The couple plan to be married June 25 in the Rose Garden at Michigan State.

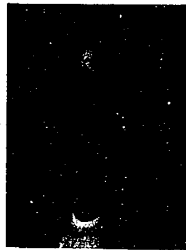


**Haack-House**

(Continued from page 1B) the last two years. The church has gone out of its way to eliminate mainly references. We're welcomed into the classrooms.

"I enjoy being a woman and want to remain feminine," she said.

About one-third of the divinity students at Garrett-Evangelical Seminary last year were women. "It's even higher than that this year. The women are taking over the men's dormitories."

**WHILE ATTENDING THE** seminary, Ms. Cowick is working on the staff of the University of Christian Ministries at Northwestern University.

For the summer months, she's been accepted at the University of Mich-

igan Hospital in Ann Arbor to work in clinical pastoral education. She'll work with dying patients, their families and hospital chaplains.

"I guess I've really been influenced by my mother as well as my dad," she said. "My mom's a dedicated nurse. Maybe that's a reason I've always wanted my own career."

Mrs. Cowick is a supervisor of nurses at a Farmington nursing home. "So I'm planning to combine both the ministry and counseling in a hospital."

When she addressed the congregation at St. Paul's Sunday, her topic was "U-Turns Permitted in Your Life." "The Gospel not only permits us to make U-turns in our lives, but requires us to," she said.
