Restaurant defies planning board

According to the township ordinance 56, if the owner or anyone acting in his behalf is found guilty of the charges, he will be subject to up to

\$100 fine and/or 90 days in the county

jail. Each day the violation continues constitutes a separate offense and sentencing does not exempt the offender from any compliance with the ordinance.

STOCKLER, WHO gained notoriety when he won a partial smoking ban in Pontiac Silverdome last year, charged the planning commission last month with "extortion" and called their 60 vote against his site plan revision a "shakedown."

The commission denied the site plan revision on three grounds:

A service road was needed in front of the building because of the increase in traffic the restaurant would generate.

 The sign was nonconforming. •There were problems with trash disposal.

"It would benefit Jax Car Wash. I can't see paying rent and paying taxes (on it)," Stockler said.

Jax Car Wash will be located north of the Fiddler deli. Its owners won a court suit against the township, which did not welcome a car wash at that lo-cation.

Stockler said he expected problems with Jax customers stacking cars in lines reaching to Maple Road. He also pointed out that the Bloomfield Canopy restaurant in the vicinity had not been required to install a service drive.

The Canopy, however, was built be-fore the township required service drives.

the plan's adoption, successfully per-suaded new businesses to dedicate roadside footage for service drives to help alleviate traffic congestion. For example, West Bloomfield Lanes, which recently opened further south on Orrehard Lake Road, dedica-ted front footage and paid \$80,000 to widen the road and bring in sewer and water utilities.

STOCKLER, WHO, threatened but has not filed a suit, has not been available for consument since the meeting and opened the deli without any public announcement.

His nephew-manager Bennett Je-rebleo said Dec. 21 that while The Gal-ley was open for business, there was "no plans" to open the Fiddler deli "yet."
