Brother Rice downs Ferndale

Birmingham Brother Rice bowled over Ferndale 70-62 behind a 30-point effort by senior guard Kevin Smith, Jan. 11 in Ferndale.

Smith, who averages about 29 points per game, also had nine assists in the game. His runningmate at guard, Tim Scheerer, scored 18 points and had eight assists.

Cranbrook's team was used to the suspense ending of the Lutheran North game. The Cranes have had two overtime games and three one-point decisions this season.
