## Taxpayers could be faced with Waldron Drain bill

gional development program. Oppertausser said it appears as if the community is being penalized because of the high income level. He referred to other monies applied for, such as senior citizen housing which have been rejected in the past.

"We've been told that we didn't qualify because we had too high of a per capita income. Even though we have an urgent need for a facility, we don't qualify because other people in the community don't need it," he said.

**COUNCILWOMAN JOANNE SMITH** indicated the city's application might have had a better chance of success if the courthouse proposal had been included in the application.

Before making the application, city legislators debated whether or not to request funding for either building a new court facility or for refurbishing one of the closed school facilities for court use.

But Majors reminded the council that wasn't feasible because plans for a court were incomplete at the time of application.

"We had to apply for projects that were far enough along. We didn't have plans for a court building and the school board still hadn't determined which school it would close," said Majors.

Since applying, the Farmington School Board has decided to close Ten Mile School. Both Farmington and Farmington Hills have been eyeing the site for a court facility.

But Councilman Fred Lichtman was less upset over the rejection. Lichtman traditionally has been opposed to asking for grants from the federal government if the city can pay for a project by itself.

"I'm not so sure we did so bad. If the community can afford to pay into the federal government, and other communities show a greater need, then maybe that's the way it's supposed to work."

"If we got back everything we put in, then why should we put into the federal government in the first place," he said.

Although this grant was rejected, city officials are hopeful that under the Carter administration, Congress will put more money into the project.
