## One more time for Dirty Harry

Using the minimum of facial expressions and the maximum of fire power, Detective Harry Callahan saves San Francisco and its kidnapped mayor from the clutches of a gang of psychotic, hippy revolutionaries—or something like that.

"The Enforcer" (R) is Clint Eastwood's third appearance as Callahan in this series that began with "Dirty Harry" and continued with "Magnum Force."

Tight-lipped and squint-eyed, Eastwood once again, and not unwillingly, dresses his rangy, invincible body with a 44 magnum and goes out after punks, prostitutes and the People's Revolutionary Army.

He's a walking detonator. When he's not firing his cannon, he's obliterating matter with a bazooka or smashing plate glass windows with a car. He launches enough energy to trigger the San Andreas fault.

**BUT THAT** doesn't matter because almost everyone in this movie is so rotten, including Harry, they deserve a cataclysmic disaster. Civilians are just so many bodies between the crooks and the cops, and it's hard to tell the difference. The police and city officials are all a—s, as Harry colorfully describes them.

The only sympathetic character is Tyne Daly as Harry's partner, Inspector Kate Moore. This play is the scriptwriters' idea of comic relief—matching the original male chauvinist pig with a female officer.

Poor Inspector Moore is reviled by Harry because she's a woman and exploited by the city hierarchy for the same reason. She's their token female officer to be paraded before the media.

Interestingly enough, Harry doesn't succumb to her charms. His body is as invincible to the allures of women as to the onslaught of bullets. It does make you think twice about how he enjoys displaying his gun with its 6½-inch barrel and shooting it off.

Although there is a bumper crop of corpses to keep the movie lively, enough so that the coroner's office never has to worry about unemployment, occasional idle moments occur: idle, but not calm.

**HARRY IS** a master of lethal language as well as weapons. He tells every other breathing being exactly what he thinks of him, where he can go and what he can do. Judging from audience reaction, he tells off authorities the way everyone would like to tell off someone, sometime.

So much for psychology and sociology. As for the mechanics of picture making, I'm sorry to say that the producers got just what they wanted. This is a fast-paced, action-filled, violence-ridden movie.

Oh, there are some plot loopholes here and there, but nothing to really detract from the mayhem: Chases, fights, explosions and murder tied together in a matrix of devastating insults. In other words, this is a boffo movie: a real box office winner.

**CARRIE (R).** Sissy Spacek plays Carrie, a teenage girl with the power of telekinesis—the ability to move objects by psychic power. She exacts a terrifying revenge on those who offend her.

**THE PINK PANTHER STRIKES AGAIN (PG).** More clowning with Inspector Clouseau (Peter Sellers) who fumbles his way to victory. This time against the demented chief inspector who would destroy the world unless he's given Clouseau, dead or alive.

**THE SEVEN PER CENT SOLUTION (PG).** Sherlock Holmes and Sigmund Freud join forces, but the result is less than stimulating. However, location photography in Vienna and Robert Duvall's performance as Dr. Watson are excellent.

**THE SHAGGY D.A. (G).** If you're looking for a "G" film, this is about the only one in town. A Disney movie about a politician with an unusual affliction.

**SILVER STREAK (PG).** Gene Wilder, Richard Pryor, Patrick McGouhan and Jill Clayburgh make tracks in this comedy-thriller about murder and mayhem on a train, and sometimes off.

**A STAR IS BORN (R).** Long-awaited remake with Barbra Streisand and Kris Kristofferson as rock stars (rather than movie stars) whose careers head in different directions.

### BACK AGAIN

**OBSESSION (PG).** Suspenseful romance with Cliff Robertson as man who falls in love with woman who looks just like his dead wife. Some bizarre consequences are the result.

**ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST (R).** Academy Award winner with Jack Nicholson in confrontation with authority in a mental hospital.

**TAXI DRIVER (R).** Robert DeNiro in terrific performance as he wheels through the rotten part of the Big Apple. Acting honors also to young Jodie Foster as a booker.

**2001: A SPACE ODYSSEY (G).** Outstanding special effects illuminate Stanley Kubrick's dazzling sci-fi movie through space and time.

## Romania opens curtain to tourists

Planning ahead for next summer's travelers, Elkin Tours announces a complete travel program to Romania.
