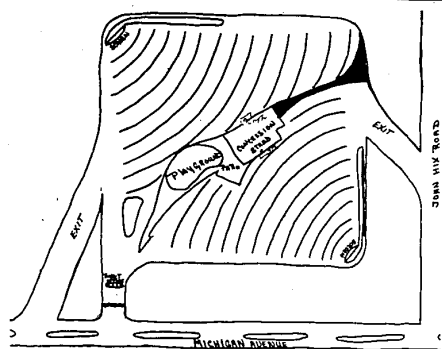


Twin Curved Screens For New Drive-In Show

WAYNE Plans for the construction of a \$750,000 twin drive-in theater by the Wayne Amusement Co. have been announced. The twin theaters, which will each hold 1,000 cars, will be constructed on a 33-acre plot at 38547 Michigan Avenue in Wayne. They will be called the Wayne Twin Drive-In.

This is the first twin drive-in theater in the metropolitan area and possibly the only one of its kind in the world. The theater will feature twin curved screens standing more than 10 stories high, four double box offices, a completely air-conditioned snack bar and a play area for children.

Wayne Amusement Co. is owned by the Safer theater family. The company also owns and operates the Quo Vadis triple outdoor theaters in Westland, the La Parisien Theatre in Garden City, and the Algiers Drive-In in Westland and the State-Wayne in Wayne.

Prized Watercolors In Display

DETROIT In an exhibition which museum officials are already calling a "sleeper," 83 vibrant watercolors by 19th and 20th century artists are now displayed in the Print Galleries of the Detroit Institute of Arts. Some of the watercolors have never been shown in Detroit, and many are by artists best known for their work in other media.

The exhibition, "Watercolors from the Permanent Collection," will be on view through Nov. 30. It was installed by Miss Ellen Sharp, curator of Graphic Arts, after a careful survey of the museum's holdings in this field.

The group will meet the second and fourth Thursday of each month from 8:15 to 10:15 p.m. in the Carl Sandburg Library on Seven Mile just west of Middle Belt.

Readings will range from The Declaration of Independence to Augustine, Macbeth, to The Communist Manifesto and the Gospel of Matthew.

The sessions begin Sept. 11 and will run until May 14 with a Christmas recess scheduled. All told, 16 different writings will be read and discussed.
