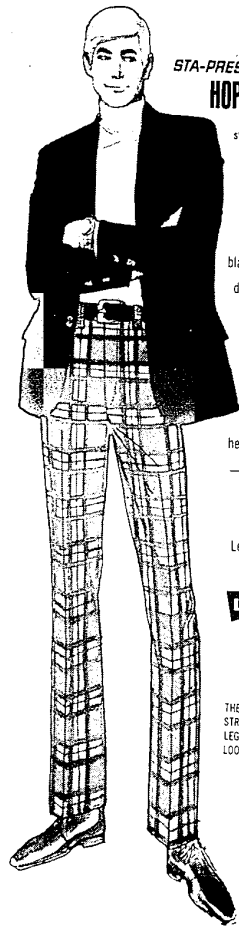

Plan Seminars

At a preschool session Aug. 19, school administrators heard a progress report from the Family Life Education Committee which was appointed by the Board of Education last March.

On Aug. 21, the group, meeting at the administration building, viewed a film, "1999 A.D."

OTHER SEMINARS in the series will include an address by Dr. Morrell Clute of Wayne State University on "Students' Rights and Responsibilities," and a report on "Ecclesiastical Groups" by Dr. Richard Lobenthal, Michigan regional director of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith.

In reviewing the current work of his group, the Rev. Hugh Steward, chairman of the Family Life Education Committee, said three task groups have been designated to make appropriate studies and suggestions on curriculum expansion.

One on substance abuse (drugs, alcohol, and tobacco) is under the direction of Rev. Karl Kaitreider. One on human sexuality is chaired by Dr. Murray N. Delington. Another on minority understanding is under the leadership of Samuel Flap.

EACH GROUP meets approximately every two weeks and plans to hold public meetings when studies are more advanced.

Additional members of the committee-as-a-whole include Mrs. Carl Kilikka, housewife and secretary of the group; Dr. Edwin Blumberg, D.O.; Mrs. Fran Copp, kindergarten teacher at Forest; Robert Deadman, chief public safety officer for the city of Farmington; Bruce Duke, real estate broker; Walter Jablonski, principal at Longacre; Rev. Albert C. Kotch, priest at St. Alexander's Catholic Church; and Miss Jill Turley, East Junior High School counselor.

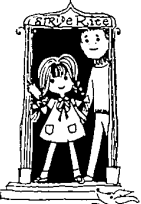

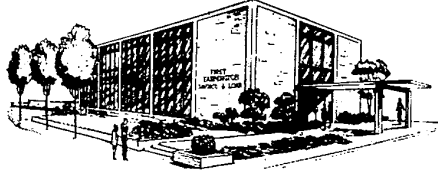
