

County Reform Is Asked

Major changes in the structure of Wayne County government will be weighed by a special committee of county supervisors.

The County Board of Supervisors, meeting Thursday, authorized its chairman, Albert J. Zak, to appoint the committee.

Creation of the committee was proposed by 23rd District Supervisor James DeSana, of Wyandotte.

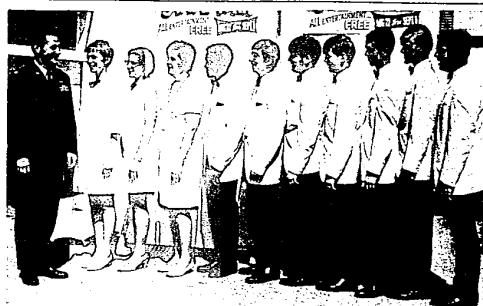
"I BELIEVE that the need for reorganization in a number of areas in county government is becoming increasingly evident to the members of the board as we complete our first year in office," DeSana declared, adding:

"I do not suggest this special committee as a substitute for county home rule, but believe that immediate consideration should be given to the question of county reorganization pending the results of a county home rule election and the ultimate development of a proposed county charter, all of which might require approximately two years."

DeSana urged that the committee have his recommendations ready before the end of the year so that amending legislation, if needed, can be submitted to the State Legislature in January. Most of the county structure is set forth in various state laws.

HE PROPOSED that the reorganization committee be authorized to consult with political scientists, government consultants and organizations such as the Citizens Research Council of Michigan, Metropolitan Fund, Inc., and the Civic Shopping, Inc.

The Board of Supervisors already is on record in favor "in principle" of placing a county home rule proposition on the ballot "as soon as practicable," which probably will be in the fall, 1970 county-wide election. A home rule proposition was defeated in the 1968 election.
