

Bruce Danto discusses family communications

Dr. Bruce Danto, director of Detroit Psychiatric Institute, will speak on "Family Communication." Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in Farmington High School. Discussion will follow his talk.

Dr. Danto recently received press attention after he interviewed Detroit children who witnessed the murder of their teacher. He was in the news again when he made a public statement that he believed the recent rash of disappearances and murders of children in the metropolitan area might be the work of a cult.

There is no charge for admission, but advance reservations are requested, through the sponsors, Farmington Youth Assistance. The staff will take reservations at 476-3840. The program is staged as an out-

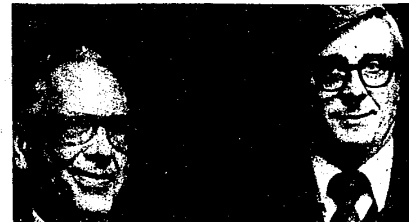
Any woman who resides in Farmington or Farmington Hills may attend.
