

The theater, and then some

Six workshops dealing with the performing arts have been developed by Wayne State University's Conference and Institutes Department in cooperation with the university's theater and music departments.

Theater will be the focal point of three of the workshops. The faculty of WSU's Hilberry and Bronstetel theatres, under the direction of Leonard Leone, will conduct the Saturday sessions dealing with acting techniques and director's methods. Mornings will deal with acting and afternoons with directing for six weeks

starting Feb. 26. Sessions will take place in McGregor Memorial Conference Center and at the Hilberry.

Promoting a play will be covered in a three-week workshop at 6:30 p.m. Monday, March 7. Each session will run for three hours in the Birmingham Center for Continuing Education.

Mailing lists, releases, brochures and media will be covered by university personnel and guest speakers.

Dennis John Tini of the WSU Music Department will conduct a workshop on songwriting. Sessions on composing and harmonizing, sessions will

start at 10 a.m. and will run for two hours. Workshop starts Feb. 19 and runs until April 23. Tini has composed numerous songs and served as pianist with such bands as John Trudell, Austin-Moro, and Buddy Rich.

A 10-week workshop on jazz starts Feb. 22 under the direction of Fred James Hartweg of WSU's music department. The first jazz workshop will concentrate on the function and use of chord changes in jazz and some techniques for improvisation. Session run from 4-6 p.m. Wednesdays.

The piano is the subject of the sixth workshop. Starting Feb. 28 and running for eight weeks, the workshop will be held from 10 a.m. to noon Mondays. The program of informal talks and technical demonstrations will be conducted by Thomas Pettit.

The last three workshops will be in the McGregor Memorial Conference Center on the WSU campus.

Jaycettes launch drive to buy cardiograph

The Michigan Jaycee Auxiliary has launched a year-long fund raising drive to purchase an echo cardiograph for Children's Hospital at the University of Michigan.

The Jaycettes have made arrangements with Gerber Products Co., which will redeem labels from any Gerber baby food, cereal or juice collected by the Jaycettes, up to a maximum of \$1,500. The company is allowing one-fifth of a cent per label, plus a bonus of 50¢ for each \$1,000 worth of labels collected by the auxiliary.

The state auxiliary formally

adopted the collection has a state project with the provision that if the necessary amount has not been raised by the end of the year, the project will be continued until the necessary funds have been raised to purchase the cardiograph.

THE ECHO cardiograph is a machine which monitors the heart and chest cavity. It is a non-traumatic approach, which enables physicians to view the chest cavity functions in infants and children without performing a surgery or catheterization. The equipment has never been purchased be-

cause of its high cost.

Lois Yates of Fremont has been elected state chairman of the project. The local chairman is Lois Koning of 21665 Mayfield, Farmington.

Mrs. Koning said that labels will be collected and verified at the district level. Gerber salesmen will visit district collection sites before state meetings and verify counts, enabling each unit to make quarterly reports.

She will accept labels from residents by mail and will take telephone calls at 477-0606.

She said it is not necessary to be a member of the Michigan Jaycee Auxiliary in order to participate.

"Anyone with Gerber labels may donate them, and they will be counted toward the purchase of the cardiograph machine for Children's Hospital," she said.

The company requests the labels be whole labels from strained, junior, or toddler food jars; front panels from cereal and snack boxes; and juice cans that have been collapsed after the ends are removed.


