The township board ordered 500 trees and some are still left, explains Betty Frankel, committee member, but they are selling at the rate of eight to 10 a day.

The trees were ordered when the Beautification Committee decided to start a tree planting program in the township. They will be delivered in early No-

vember and all are guaranteed for one full year.

Varieties available include sugar maple, Norway maple, and skyline thoraless hone judges, which was a supplementation of the sugar maple with trunk diameters between 1-1/4 to 1-1/2 inches.

The sugar maple will grow to 100 feet tall, and the honey locust between 40-75 feet.
