**Gilders launch drive for Meadow Brook Hall**

Meadow Brook Hall—the 100-room mansion on campus of Oakland University in Rochester—has been designated as an historic site and a new organization formed to help insure its continued preservation.

A reception-dinner meeting Feb. 5 kicked off a membership drive for Gilders of Meadow Brook Hall, with a steering committee headed by Mr. and Mrs. Howard H. Kehrl of Bloomfield Hills.

Durwood B. Varner, Oakland University chancellor emeritus and now chairman of the University of Nebraska Foundation, returned to the campus to announce the historic site designation.

The Michigan Historical Commission has judged the hall to be of significant historic interest, said Varner. The commission named the former Wilson home to be included in the State Register of Historic Sites.

Brochures describing Gilders' purpose and membership categories were to be mailed out by Feb. 15, according to Mr. and Mrs. Kehrl.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES for Gilders are: associate, \$25 per year; sponsor, \$200; patron, \$500; benefactor, \$1,000; gold key lifetime, \$5,000; and gold key 'President's Club, \$10,000.

All memberships, except associates, are allowed special Meadow Brook Hall touring and dining privileges. Contributions are tax deductible and qualify for Michigan income tax credit and matching fund programs, according to the steering committee.

They will make their home in Adrian.



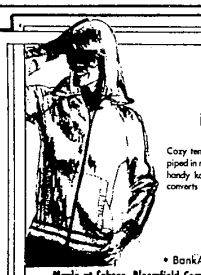

Deadline for completed applications is May 6.

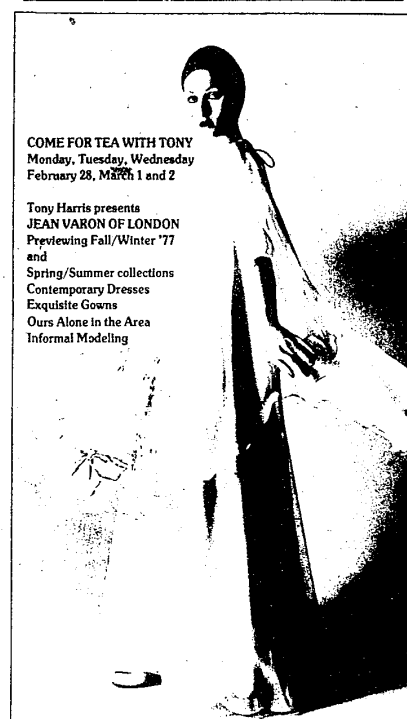
