

LWV undertakes study of the city

A variety of views of Detroit and what it means to metropolitan area residents will be presented at a conference in the Detroit Institute of Arts March 18.

"The Reality of the Urban Vision" is the theme of the all-day program planned by the League of Women Voters in cooperation with the Center of Urban Studies at Wayne State University.

Registration begins at 9:30 a.m., and like all league activities, it is open to the public.

Persons wishing to attend must register on or before March 11 with the West Bloomfield-Farmington, LWV, 626-4095.

The \$5 registration fee includes lunch and tour of the institute after the program.

The event will open with Dr. Corinne Gibb, a history professor at Wayne, discussing "The Meaning of the City." Fiscal problems of the city will be outlined by former City of De-

troit controller Dr. Bernard Klein, professor of political science at University of Michigan-Dearborn.

Responding to their views will be Dr. Frederick Cummings, director of the institute; Diane Edgecombe, executive vice president of the Central Business District Association; and Beverly McAninch, a Plymouth city commissioner.

THE AFTERNOON speaker will be WSU economics professor Dr. John Mattila, who has completed a study of jobs and industry in the metropolitan area.

Responding to issues in those areas will be Lowell Baker, director of employment for New Detroit, Inc.

The meeting is the first in the Detroit area devoted to a national League of Women Voters "Study of the Problems of the Large Cities."

Plans are for future activity on these issues by the 16 leagues in the tri-county area.

A bloodmobile will be at Harrison High School from 4 to 9 p.m. March 29, sponsored by the Farmington School District in cooperation with the American Red Cross.

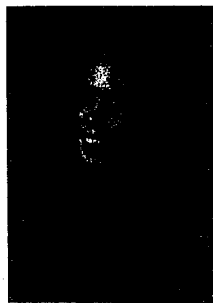
Nadine Goodman, chairman of the P.T.A. Council's health committee, said, "A successful program will mean that all residents in the school district and their immediate family

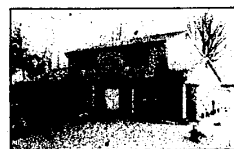

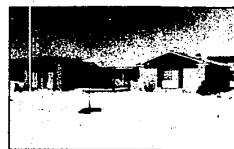
