

Concert memorizes Phil Hart

A long standing love affair between Phil Hart and the people of Michigan was evident Tuesday as hundreds gathered to pay tribute to his memory. "I'm here because I loved Phil Hart," said Maine Senator Edmund Muskie during the brief program during intermission of a Detroit Symphony Orchestra concert at Ford Auditorium.

The Hart Memorial Concert was planned in accordance with the senator's request that a scholarship fund at Lake Superior State College be his only memorial.

Muskie's words echoed the sentiment of those who came to carry out that dying wish. Few in that audience would have disagreed.

"Everybody who is somebody will be here," a local telesetter remarked earlier. "There are an amazing number of somebody's from the most distinguished public servants to the simplest citizen. All were somebody's in Phil Hart's eyes."

FIRST LADY Rosalyn Carter flew from Washington with Treasury Secretary W. Michael Blumenthal, former senator Eugene McCarthy and others for the concert. It was the first such public appearance Mrs. Carter has agreed to make since her husband was inaugurated two months ago.

Senator Hart's widow, Jane Briggs Hart introduced the First Lady who was dressed in a simple ice blue long

gown with fitted sleeves and a high mock-turtle neck.

"I did not know Phil Hart personally," Mrs. Carter said. "But I knew of his goodness and his inspiration. He was a superb example to everyone of us as a public servant and as a good man."

Mrs. Carter attended a dinner and reception at the Detroit Plaza Hotel in Renaissance Center before the concert. She was escorted into Ford Auditorium by Detroit Mayor Coleman Young.

Sen. Donald Riegle, who won Hart's seat in last November's election, praised the Hart family as one of the late senator's most beautiful legacies referred to Hart's "justice, equity, loving, caring independence of thought and integrity in all things."

Sen. Robert Griffin quipped that one should think during a token Rebuplican for being there.

"Lots of Republicans are here tonight. The center aisle in the senate divided us politically, but it never interfered with our friendship," he said.

Four standing ovations were accorded the participants during the program, three to women—Mrs. Hart, Mrs. Carter and petite Ann Hart, the senator's daughter and soprano soloist for the concert.

The fourth ovation was for former governor and now State Supreme Court Justice G. Menem Williams of Birmingham. Captain's "A Lincoln Portrait" closed the concert.

Williams, in whose administration Hart served as lieutenant governor, presented Miss Hart with a spray of red roses after her performance and encore. Miss Hart made her professional debut just weeks ago in a Michigan Opera Theatre production of "Magic Flute."

Board considers new trustee, budget, millage

Members of the Southfield Board of Education will meet Thursday evening to examine school millage proposals and the 1977-78 school year budget. Board members may also vote to appoint a new trustee to fill the vacancy of Robert Schwarz who is living the board after three years to take over Milwaukee.

The board will meet for a public hearing at 7 p.m. in House B Gaffetteria, Southfield High School. During the meeting board members are expected to discuss proposals for the June 13 millage election and the upcoming school budget.

At 8 p.m., during a specially-called meeting of the board, the school board will examine the impact of the new Freedom of Information Act and the Open Meetings Act.

In other action, the board will rule on a new contract for Supt. Carl Haselton and the appointment of a new school board trustee. The board member will serve with the school board until a new member can be elected June 13 to fill the remaining one year of the four-year term.

Both meetings are open to the public. Southfield High School is at Laker and Ten Mile roads.
