

House studies class safety

to get more abuse and therefore should be checked," he says.
The bill also would provide for consultation with local school officials by state inspectors on how shop classes can be made safer. Seminars also would be conducted by state personnel, says Brotherton.

Brotherton admits that some fine tuning had to be done to the bill since he introduced it. Under the old bill, students could make direct complaints about safety conditions. Opponents, says Brotherton, feared that students could turn the device into an harassing technique.

"Now parents of students must file the complaint under the new bill. The only time a student could lodge a complaint is in an emergency situation."
If passed, the bill would require that the phone number of the state's department of labor be posted in school shop classes. Parents could either complain to the state or the local school board administration.

Financing for the inspectors would be from a one-half of one per cent garnered from workmen's compensation.

"Money for state inspectors isn't all being used right now, anyway,"

Brotherton hopes his bill will pass because of support he has received from State Sen. David Plawecki (D-Deerborn Heights), a labor supported legislator, who has introduced a similar bill in the state senate.

Labors primary opposition to the bill is that it would take inspection time away from other industry, says Brotherton.

"But, I don't really see that as a problem. The inspectors come to the schools, anyway. They would just have to spend a little more time checking out other machines."
