

Tree plantings honor Bnai Brith presidents

Martin Weston, president of the Metropolitan Detroit Bnai Brith Council and Rhea Rowe, president of the Bnai Brith Women's Council of Metropolitan Detroit, will each be honored with the establishment of a tree project in the Bnai Brith Martyrs Forest, overlooking Jerusalem.

The planting will be announced at the 11th annual Bnai Brith presidents branch on May 1 at Adat Shalom Synagogue, Farmington Hills. The branch will be in cooperation with the Jewish National Fund.

At that time, each current president of the 24 lodges and 26 chapters and units of the metropolitan Bnai Brith will be honored by the planting of 18 trees in the Martyrs Forest in recognition of their efforts.

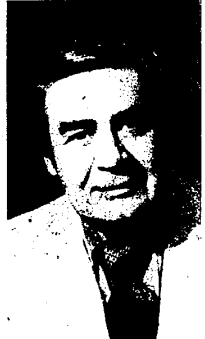
