 Warden's Wage Constant War on Unprincipled Slayers of Feathered Friends of the Farmer.

The question of the birds on protected lands is an important part of the work of the federal and state authorities. Although state and national laws have been passed making it wrong to kill the birds for their plumes, plum hunters are constantly raiding the nests of the waterfowl and killing them for the sake of the price the wings will bring. Thus a constant watch is necessary. Terrible hounds are constantly hovering along the shores of the reservations and more than one pileated hawk has been caught to save the egret or curlew from slaughter. In Florida, one of the best game wardens of the Audubon society was killed by bird butchers.

If there was still the robin the chief of the fruit, and here him for his early morning raids on their berries would realize that the little fruit spoiled in a little desert for the huge quantity of insects killed before the berries were eaten. Then their feelings would be more kindly. Outworn and crannies, which do great harm to grain crops, are favorite foods for robins, while on berries, vine worms, etc., are eaten in great numbers.—Exchange.
