VERDICT \$4,075

AUTOMOBILE DAMAGE SUIT

Kalamazoo, Mich., April 2, 1919.

In the circuit court today the jury brought in a verdict of \$4,075 against J. Allen Snyder to recover for injuries sustained by Frederick Uithoven as a result of an automobile accident in which it is claimed that Frederick Uithoven has suffered injuries of a serious nature. J. Allen Snyder was insured in one of the small insurance companies which gave him protection for \$800 for liability and he will have to pay the amount of \$3,275.

"BIG FOUR" ADOPT WILSON COVENANT

LEAGUE OF NATIONS DOCUMENT APPROVED WITHOUT VOTE OF DISSENT.

BRITON NAMED AS SECRETARY

French and Japanese Amendments Not Incorporated, Clearing Way for Unanimous Acceptance.

Paris.—The covenant of the League of Nations in revised form, moved by President Wilson, was adopted April 27 by the peace conference in plenary session without a dissenting vote.

President Wilson, addressing the conference, explained the amendments to the League of Nations covenant. He did not read the entire revised text, but Lydia E. Pinkham's.

In speaking of the amendment recognizing the Monroe Doctrine, the President merely referred to it as a new article.

The president's motion also named Sir James Eric Drummond secretary general of the league and provided for a committee to inaugurate the league.

Thus one of the notable works of the conference passes its final stage and is incorporated in the peace treaty.

The French and Japanese amendments after a brief discussion were not pressed, and the way thus was cleared for unanimous acceptance of the league.

Italy was not represented at the session, but the name of Italy appears as one of the members of the league in the covenant as finally adopted.

Nine labor principles were adopted for insertion in the treaty.

The session adjourned Monday without considering the report on responsibilities provided for the trial of the former German emperor by five judges from the great powers.

This report was handed in by the Council of Four and embodies in the Council treaty a provision for the former emperor's prosecution.

This however, had not as yet been adopted by the plenary conference.

DETROIT PLANS WORLD'S FAIR

Immense Project Proposed For 1923—Schwab May Be Organizer.

Detroit.—Detroit the Dynamic will be the host city for the front view of metropolitan cities with a World Peace Exposition in 1922 or 1923, demonstrating to the world its marvelous industrial growth, which in a decade has made its name a by-word among nations.

Big names are already associated with the undertaking. Charles M. Schwab, the magnetic steel magnate, has consented to be the organizer of the exposition.

A municipal bond issue of \$10,000,000 is contemplated.

The next step will be to enlist Government aid. Michigan's representatives in Congress will be asked to obtain \$10,000,000 from the Federal Government. Stock would be sold to finance the corporation in addition to municipal aid.

The selection of the site is still a matter of discussion. The Mayor has suggested the stretch from Waterworks Park to Grosse Pointe.

HAMBURG REVOLT SUPPRESSED

Military Governor, With 30,000 Troops Put End to Rioting.

Stockholm.—The revolt in Hamburg has apparently been suppressed, due to measures of the military governor, who gathered a force of 30,000 men, principally volunteers, with which he surrounded the revolutionary quarters of the town, disarmed the inhabitants and seized all arms and ammunition found in the houses.

Strong detachments patrolled the richer quarters while torpedo boats policed the harbor and quays.

NO U. S. DOCTRINE FOR MEXICO

Carranza Disavows Adherence to Monroe Tenets.

Mexico City.—The non-recognition of the Monroe Doctrine by the Mexican government and the recall from Paris of Alberto J. Paul, minister to France, to await orders in Spain, formed the substance of two statements printed by Mexico City papers as having been given out by Salvador Diego Fernandez, chief of staff in charge of the department of foreign relations.

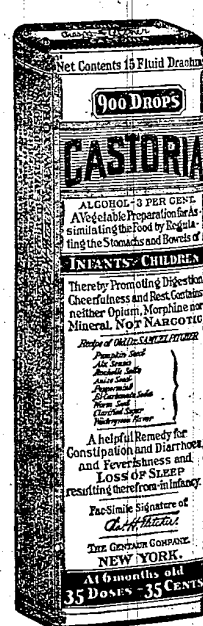
