Home Town Helps

JUDGE CITY BY ITS STREETS

Importance of Well Laid Out and Property Kept Thoroughfares Can not Be Overestimated.

Streets are the lines of expression on a city's face. They are the ideographs of time, recording the thoughts, impulses of the city and the city within. They are the indices of a city's character at the lines on a human face, a betrays of whatever is ugly and sordid, and a earnest of whatever is serene and noble and strong.

"There are mean streets," says H. J. and streets that are merely busy; there are young streets that are formed any opinion, there are mean streets—streets that we may call the oldest hags; streets that we may call clean streets, workaday streets and commercial streets. Some streets are well laid out and well kept."

In a city where the streets have been discarded to promote convenience and advantages of commercial thoroughfares there are just such streets which distort and mar its beauty. It is a nation with its here in America, with the encroachment of business upon a residential district, tree-lined, shady and inviting, to invade with vandals and mar the trees. There is an irreverence in such practices; beauty and charm have been turned to the uses of better and trade.

PLAY PARKS TO FOLLOW WAR

Splendid Idea Which Has Arisen in Canada That Well Be Emulated in This Country.

Play parks for children, which will stand for all time as peace memorials, will be established in all the principal cities of Canada in plans of the Ottawa Horticultural society, supported by the Ottawa playgrounds association, are reported out.

"The purpose of the parks will be to help make impossible for children the reality of another war to hold up for emulation for all time that spirit of unselfishness which stirred those of this generation and enabled them to secure for mankind the advantages of peace; and to encourage all those who enjoy the first fruits of peace to dedicate to the ideals of civilization a memorial which shall have the significance of a guaranty that the future will have a national measure of joys and rewards."

The parks, according to plans, will enable children to enjoy summer and winter sports and recreations. They will be centers for holding annual peace exhibitions. In their spare moments will be erected a tablet, perhaps, on which will be recorded each year some of the dominant benefits peace has conferred upon the world.

Architecture Important.
