HAWKER, MISSING AIRMAN, IS SAFE

MOURNED AS DEAD FOR WEEK—
SMALL DANISH STEAMER
EFFECTS RESCUE.

FOUND 800 MILES FROM SHORE

Had Been Forced to Alight, Because of Engine Trouble, After Making 1,100 Miles Across Ocean.

London—Missing six days and virtually given up as lost, Mary G. Hawker and his navigator, Lieutenant Commander Mackenzie Grive, British airman who essayed a flight across the Atlantic ocean without protection against disaster save what their frail aeroplane afforded, are safe.

Some 1,100 miles out from Newfoundland and 800 from the Irish coast, on Monday, May 19, the aviators, making the best of an engine which was failing to function properly, were forced to alight on the water. The little Danish steamer Mary, bound from New Orleans and Norfolk for Aarhus, Denmark, picked up the wayfarers and continued on her northward voyage. The Sopwith aeroplane was not salvaged.

Lacking a wireless outfit, the captain of the steamer was obliged to withhold the good tidings of the rescue until he was opposite Butt of Lewis where the information was signalled by means of flags, that Hawker and Grive were aboard his ship.

When the aeroplane sped away from her starting point, Hawker let loose his wheels and under gear, thereby lightening the weight of the machine by a considerable amount, but making a possible landing on the soft of Ireland a more hazardous venture. This, however, probably proved of much advantage when it became necessary to alight on the water. The aeroplane remained aloft without difficulty during the hour and a half it took the Danish steamer to come up and effect a rescue.

The London Daily Mail, which offered a purse of \$50,000 for the first flight of a heavier-than-air craft across the Atlantic ocean, will give Hawker and Grive a consolation prize of \$25,000.

339TH BACK IN AMERICA JULY 4

Arrangements Made to Have Fast Ships Meet Men at Liverpool.

New York—Basing their estimate on the report that the first of the British troops in north Russia would leave Archangel by June 1, port authorities said the entire 339th Infantry would be in the United States by July 4.

It is expected this regiment will leave Liverpool by June 15 and, possibly, have been made to have fast ships there to meet them, so that there will be but little delay. It is not expected the troops will remain in England more than two days, army officials said.

Nurses, officers and enlisted men agree that nearly all the men that fought in the swamps and snow fields of north Russia have developed some sort of sickness, so there may be a delay in effecting discharges for the 339th men.

ASKS BILLION FOR RAILROADS

Director-General Says Operating Deficit Was Due to War.

Washington—Appropriation of \$1,200,000,000 in addition to \$500,000,000 already provided, for use of the railroad administration during 1919 and 1920, has been requested by Director General Hines.

The estimate revealed that there had been an operating deficit of \$22,184,848 during the last calendar year, and of \$250,000,000 during the first four months of 1919.

Of the total of \$1,700,000,000 appropriated and requested Mr. Hines said that \$1,214,000,000 "eventually would be returned to the treasury."

TOLEDO HAS LAST WILD NIGHT

Passing of Booze in Ohio Marked by "Grand and Glorious" Orgies.

Toledo, O.—Toledo last Saturday engaged in the wildest orgy of her history—the celebration that marked the farewell to John Barleycorn in Ohio.

Although state-wide prohibition did not become effective until Monday, May 26, only about 300 of the state's 5,000 bar proprietors elected to remain open the extra day by paying a \$305 license fee.

Ann Arbor—Five Chinese believed to have been smuggled over the Canadian border at Detroit were captured in a shack on the McMillan farm in York township and taken to the Washtenaw county jail. Two men believed to be in charge of the smuggling were arrested at Adrian when they drove there in a car bearing a Canadian license. It is believed the Chinese were smuggled across to Belle Isle where an auto was waiting for them.
