The first regular aero mail service of the world was started by the United States government, May 15, 1918, between New York and Washington. The actual flying time made was three hours and twenty minutes, including 35 minutes' stop for refueling at Philadelphia. At that time the fastest railroad train record between the two cities was five hours. The airship time has since been reduced to two hours and thirty minutes. First Post Offices in Maine. In 1776 the first post offices in Maine were established at Kennebec, Farmouth and Bath. The mails were carried by carriers on foot or on horseback and the average weight of mail did not amount to five letters at each office. The rates were high, \$4; 124, 184, 25 and 374 cents, according to the distance the letter had to be carried, and double the rate when the letter was one more than one sheet of paper.
