A suggestion has been made by one of the large anthractic coal operators that they be permitted to increase the percentage of impurities in the coal by 2 per cent more than the present standard. This means that 1,590,000 additional toas of slare would be sent to market. "Meats in Storage"

Every working day of the year 75,000,000 pounds of meat are required to supply home and export needs-and only 10 per cent of this is exported.

These facts must be kept in mind when considering the U. S. Bureau of Markets report that on June 1, 1919. there were 1,348,000,000 pounds of meats in cold storage. If the meat in storage was placed on the market it would only be 20 days' supply.

This meat is not artificially withheld from trade channels to maintain or advance prices.

Ments in storage consist of-

65 per cent (approximate) hams, bacon, etc., in process of caring. It takes 30 to 90 days in pickle or salt to complete the process.

per cent is frozen pork that is to be cured

per cent is lard. This is only four-fifths of a pound per capita, and much of it will have to go to supply European needs.

per cent is frozen beef and lamb, part of which is owned by the Government and was intended chiefly for over-seas ship-ment. If this were all diverted to dome-tic trade charnels, it would be enty 1½ lbs. per capita—a 3 days' supply.

From this it will be seen that "meats in storage" represent merely unfinished goods in process of curing and the working supply necessary to assure the consumer a steady flow of finished
