Comprehensive Extension of the Present Food Control Act Is Recommended.

SITUATION CRITICAL AND DIFFICULT AND MUST BE MET WITH COURAGE AND RESOURCE.
Calm and Deliberate Consideration Rather Than Hasty Action Is Called For by the Present Situation of the Country.

Ivory Mats.
There are but two mats of ivory in existence. The largest one measures 8 by 4 feet; and, although made in the north of India, has a Greek design for a border. It is used only on state occasions. Like the signing of important state documents. The cost of this precious mat was almost incalculable, for more than 6,000 pounds of pure ivory were used in its construction.
