



YANKEE HEROES DECORATED WITH FOREIGN WAR CROSSES

THAMES OARSMEN SALUTING THE ROYAL BARGE







POST STOOD FOR CENTURIES

Relic Recently Sold in England is Old Even as Antiquarians Count Ages of Things.

Whoever bought the corner post that once stood near the abbey at Burton-on-Trent, England, when it came up for sale, the other day in London, acquired a venerable curiosity. The post has been described on good authority as having been first set up not later than 1360, and the old building that once stood beside it, and has been described as "the tall building in the Market place called the Garioffs," long since vanished. About a hundred years ago somebody took the ancient relic to the Isle of Anglesey; but in the 1840s one of the local families of importance purchased it and brought it home to Burton-on-Trent.
