

TREAT OATS AND WHEAT FOR SMUT

Reports Show That it Pays to Use Formaldehyde at Time of Planting Crops.

WORK OF DIFFERENT AGENTS

Practically None of Flights Given Treatment Showed Any Signs of Disease—Farmers of Porter County Lost \$140,000.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.) Evidence that it pays to treat wheat and oats at the time of planting with formaldehyde to prevent smut is given in reports of a number of demonstrations conducted by Indiana county agents.

Work in Warren County. As a result of the demonstration conducted by the county agent in Warren county it was found that a plot of oats planted with untreated seed showed 83 per cent smut, while another plot in the same field planted with treated seed was free from the disease.

Smut in Steuben County. The county agent of Steuben county, in company with a representative of the United States department of agriculture, found one-tenth of one per cent of smut on untreated heads, and considerably more than 50

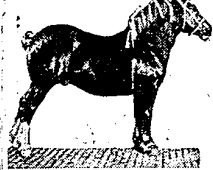
GOOD STALLIONS TO IMPROVE COLT CROP

MAKE MONEY RAISING BARLEY

Experiments Show it Will Surpass Corn as a Ration for Raising Hogs if Properly Fed.

Experiments at the Wisconsin experiment station show that barley will surpass corn as a ration for fattening hogs if it is properly fed. Twelve lots of pigs were fed, using with some a corn ration, while the others were given barley.

One of the most interesting facts brought out was the value of a barley and whey combination, which netted a handsome return, and the gains made with this ration were very rapid.
