Dean made that comment last Priday after his team finished its regular-season with a 16-2 overall record—the most successful basketball showing in the school's 17-year history.

Waiting to face North Farmington will be either Detroit Mackenzie (16-2 regular-season record) of the Public School League, or Bloomfield Hills Lahser (17-3) of the Metro Suburban Association. "We're going to have to play one

hell of a game no matter which team we face on Friday," said Dean after the Cody game. "I hope we play as well on Friday as we did today."

North needed a big second half to defeat Cody. Coach Rob Menefee's Comels trailed by three points (42-39) at halftime. But North outscored Cody by eight (20-12) in the third quarter, and by six (24-18) in the fourth.

FOUR RAIDER starters scored in double figures. Jeff Thomas, a 6-foot-5 senior, led the balanced attack with 20 points. Mark Biehl and Harold Beard-sley, who form North's 6-7 front line, added 18 and 12 points, respectively, and Mark Thompson contributed 10.

Ozell Washington, a 6-1 senior forward, led Cody with 16 points. Darryl Blount added 16 points, and Lawrence Hicks had 14.

North shat 57 percent from the floor, making 33 of 58 shots, while Cody shot 40 percent (29 of 71). North controlled he boards, 38-23, with Thomas hauling down 18 rebounds and Biehl gathering

"Cody had a tendency to throw it up from the outside, and we were real good about blocking out when they missed." Dean said.


