Free immunizations set for Farmington March 9

Farmington area residents can receive free immunizations and tuberculin skin tests from 9 a.m. to noon, March 9, at the First Methodist Church, located on the corner of Warner and Grand River in Farmington.

The immunization program, which includes protection from measles, Ger-

man measles, mumps, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough, is offered to all Oakland County residents two months of age and older.

Appointments are not required. Children must be accompanied by legal guardians. Bring any previous immunization records with you.
