PTA sends out call for blood donors

The Farmington PTA Council, in cooperation with the local American Red Cross Council, in cooperation with the local American Red Cross sponsors a bloodmobile March 21 in the Harrison High School auxiliary gym. Hours for donors are from 4 to 10 p.m. Mrs. R. J. Barber, health chairman for the council, passes along the blood donor screening criteria from South-eastern Michigan Red Cross Blood Center.

"If you can answer the following questions with a no," she says, "you can usually donate blood."

1) Do you weigh less than 110 pounds?
2) Have you donated blood in the last eight weeks?
3) Do you have a history of hepatitis? Have you had close contact with anyone having hepatitis in the last six months?

4) Have you been pregnant in the last six weeks?
5) Have you had teeth extractions or oral surgery within the past three days?

6) Have you had a small pox vaccination within two weeks?
7) Are you taking insulin for diabetes?

8) Have you had penicillin within 48 hours?

9) Have you had an attack of malaria or been on antimalarial medication in the last three years? Have you been in an area where malaria is endemic in the last six months?

10) Have you had major surgery in the past six months?

DONORS MUST be between the ages of 17 and 66. Seventeen year olds must have written parental consent. Persons on medications generally may donate, as long as their general health is satisfactory.

"By establishing a goal of annual blood donations," Mrs. Barber said, "the American Red Cross will provide total blood coverage for the residents of the Farmington School District and their families."

Persons wishing to donate blood are asked to contact the elementary school in their neighborhood.

Price is right on eggs for Easter

The Easter bunny won't have any problem finding eggs at reasonable prices this year.

Production is up and current egg prices are holding steady before their seasonal decline in the spring, according to Sheila Morley, Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service food marketing specialist.

Easter and St. Patrick's Day will spur special menu plans in many consumer kitchens this month. Ms. Morley predicts an Easter ham may cost less this year than a St. Patrick's Day corned beef cut, but a menu featuring poultry could cost least of all.

"Turkey is economical as well as festive," says Ms. Morley, "and it has outgrown its handicap of being considered a main course only for Christmas or Thanksgiving. Consumers are eating whole turkeys and turkey products all year round because they are nutritious, tasty and the price is right."
