

# Over 30 hockey playoffs

## Penske, Sawyer to vie for title

The Southfield Over 30 Hockey League's playoff championship will be decided today when Sawyer-Fuller Funeral Home plays Roger Penske Chevrolet at 7:40 p.m. at the Southfield Civic Center Arena.

The eight-team league was divided into even and odd numbered divisions for the post-season playoffs. Penske tops the odd division with a 2-0 record, and Sawyer-Fuller leads the even division with a 2-0-1 mark.

Sawyer-Fuller survived as the only unbeaten team in the playoffs by battling Concourse Camera to a 1-1 dead-lock last Thursday.

Don Ellis scored for Sawyer-Fuller with the assists going to Denny Smith and Ray Brunetti. Paul Kenzie scored

Concourse's goal with help from Jim Lepine and Don Brooks. The game remained tied after a frantic overtime.

Roger Penske, which finished the regular season in seventh place, qualified for a crack at the playoff championship by beating Star Lincoln-Mercury, 3-2, in overtime last Thursday.

After a scoreless first period, Penske's Mike Nave scored on a play set up by Tom Martinek and Bob Kieft. John O'Dell, assisted by Russ Stable, made it 2-0 for Penske before the second period ended.

Star came to life in the third period with goals by Chuck Drake and Mike Foster. Jack Walton, Wally Murner and Mike Prentice were credited with assists. In the three-minute overtime,

Penske's Tom Magnell scored a short-handed goal set up by O'Dell with just 31 seconds remaining.

Holiday Inn of Southfield, which won the regular-season title, defeated Spartan Concrete, 4-2, in another game. Holiday Inn got two goals from John Thomas, and one each from Dimitrios Lampros and Denny Smith. Gary Bean had two assists for the winners. Joe George and Lee Fitzpatrick each scored a goal for Spartan.

Suburban Sports Center upended Northland Heating, 4-2. Northland grabbed a 2-0 lead with goals by Bob Hawk and Gary Mosey. Suburban, however, came back with two goals each by John Waterman and Bill Boyd. The loss was the third of the

playoffs and the 24th in a row since the season started last October.

In addition to the Penske-Sawyer-Fuller game on Thursday, three other contests will be held to determine the final Over 30 playoff standings.

The visitor is Jeanette Robinson of Flint, who really showed the Detroiters something over the past weekend when she moved to the top in two divisions of the women's city tournament and then came right back Monday night and took top honors in the Bowlerettes all-star league.

Jerry Cole was right behind them with a 651 that included a 265 game. On the women's side, Jane Martin showed the way with 225 in 593.

Gloria Meritz had a 561. Margy Brothers was third with 560 and Marge Krupaek landed fourth with a 219 game in a 555 series.

In the Monday men's league, John Hurley had a 267 in 688.

Two of the senior citizens also moved into the spotlight when John Lev-

ich had a 211 in 581 and Vi Veith, one of the oldest in the league, came through with a 540.

When the handicaps were figured, both Beris and Moeller tied at 607 to share series honors.
