Roy Brandon scored the winning goal in overtime with the assists going to Gerry Feldman and Frank Goldberg. With just 18 seconds left in regulation time, Goldberg scored the tying goal from Ray Miras. Sawyer-Fuller was killing off a penalty at the time.

Penske, which finished the regular season in seventh place and then went 2-2 in the playoffs, got two goals from Bob Heflik. Gary LeMiere assisted on one tally, and Mike Nave set up the other.

In another playoff game last Thursday, Holiday Inn of Southfield, the regular-season champion with a 12-45 mark, dropped a 4-3 decision to Suburban Sports Center in overtime.

Suburban jumped out to a 2-0 lead on goals by John Waterman and Jim O'Dea. Bill Swink and Bob Tarnow each scored a goal for Holiday Inn as the first period ended in a two-all tie. After a scoreless second period, Bill

Boyd scored to put Suburban in front again, but Jim Clement replied for Holiday Inn, and the regulation play ended in a 3-3 deadlock.  
With only 17 seconds left in the overtime period, Waterman converted a pass from Bill Boyd to give Suburban the victory.

Star Lincoln-Mercury, with Mike Prentice scoring three goals, defeated Concourse Camera, 8-5, in another game.  
In addition to Prentice's hat trick, Star got two goals each from Bryson Maddick and Chuck Drake as well as a single tally from Gary Feldman. Concourse's five goals were spread among five players — Norm Cohen, Paul Kezede, Don Brooks, Ray Tremblay and Jay Stratoff.

Spartan Concrete, which finished in third place in the regular-season standings, closed out its playoff effort with a 4-1 victory over winless Northland Heating.

Lee Fitzpatrick scored a pair of goals for Spartan, and teammates Joe George and Larry Darne each added a goal. Northland's lone goal came off the stick of Ernest Pietila. It's been a rough season for Northland, which failed to win a game in 25 outings.

Bolestering the pitching corps through the junior college route, Dieters acquired a trio of hurlers from Oakland County Community College: Tim Seagraves, a 1975 Birmingham Brother Rice graduate, Seashole grad Jim Kazanski and Tom Libby could fill in as starters or relievers during the grueling 56-game schedule (all but two doubleheaders).

Also figuring in OU's pitching picture are returners Dennis McQuade from Oita and Steve Luczak.

Another former Oakland Community College player, Bob Griffin, will share catcher duties with Don McArthur, while Jay Lentz tends right field. Mark Bieski holds down center, and Brian Cunningham and Sterling Heights Henry Ford grad Ed Vojtech will alternate in left field.
