# We're being 'Indian givers'

They are perfect examples of an "Indian-giver." HR 4168 and SB 842, HR 996 and HR 965 would repeal all Indian treaties in the United States; six other bills would end Indian control over reservation lands and HR 9651 would eliminate tribal control over water rights.

With judicious calculation, we have heretofore agreed and signed to with the native Americans. And that is precisely what the phrase "Indian-giver" means.

Admittedly, the current treaties with the Indian tribes create complex and expensive problems for us. Giving the Indians all the land we didn't want 100 or more years ago was the easiest way to get them out of our way.

But today we need the land, the minerals under it and the water that falls on top of it. And what is possibly just as important—where we have already moved in without regard to the existing treaties, the judgments of our courts have gone against us and now charge us with felonious acts. Need for the elements of life and the need to be right are forcing us to do strange things.

The effort to repeal the treaties may be a step in the direction of justice, but it certainly destroys the concept of justice that should be our primary concern. Wiping out existing treaties does legalize what we want to do, but it completely negates what we so fervently espouse in our Preamble to the Constitution.

Redress for all our injustices against the native Americans will hardly be accomplished by pretending the treaties should never have existed and making sure they no longer do. And the compounding of injustice by unilateral action will only complicate whatever avenue might exist to correct these wrongs.

On Feb. 11 of this year, some 180 men, women and children from various Indian tribes set off from San Francisco on a walk across the continent to Washington. They want to assert their existence and present their critique of the pending anti-Indian legislation.

It is being called "The Longest Walk." It would seem that that designation might better describe what is before us in correcting an accumulation of injustices and arrogant assumptions that we have used to effectively demean and decimate a whole people.

But until we turn around and head in the right direction, our walk will lead us nowhere.

# Clergymen offered summer program

"Journeying in Faith" is the major theme of the 1978 summer program beginning July 3 at SS. Cyril and Methodius Seminary and St. Mary College at Orchard Lake, northwest of Detroit. Eight different courses, including six that will run for three weeks and two for two weeks, have been scheduled, featuring nationally-known authors and lecturers.

Five of the courses will be held in the mornings, two in the afternoons, and one in the evenings.

According to Dr. Carl L. Middleton, director of the program, the courses are designed to "explore faith as a journey from a variety of perspectives."

"Faith is a total response to life," Middleton said. "It is a journey in partnership with the living God."

The schedule includes: "Developing Pastoral Identity" taught by the Rev. Dennis J. Goaney, S.S.A., director of field education at Catholic Theological Union and a noted author and lecturer;

"Biblical Views of Faith in One God," taught by Fr. Joseph Szweczyk, associate professor of systematic theology at the Orchard Lake Seminary;

"Medium is the Message" by Fr. Clifford Ruskowski, assistant professor of communication arts and humanities at St. Mary College. He is host of a weekly radio program, "Merry Go Round," on WXYZ, Detroit.

"Exploring the Sacraments" by Fr.

Francis Koper, rector of SS. Cyril and Methodius Seminary and assistant professor of religious education and pastoral theology.

"Analysis of the National Catechetical Directory," by Middleton, who also is director of continuing education and an assistant professor of systematic theology at the Orchard Lake institutions.

"Catechetical Formation" by Robert Totten, supervisor of catechetical formation for the Archdiocese of Detroit.

"Comparative Studies in Patristics and Contemporary Theology," by Fr. Eugene Edy, associate professor of church history and dogma at Orchard Lake.

"Human Sexuality: A Dialogue

Toward Understanding," by Fr. John Harvey, professor of moral theology at DeSales Hall, Washington, D.C., and Fr. Joseph Kosnik, dean and professor of moral theology at the Orchard Lake Seminary.

Fr. Kosnik was chairman of the five-member committee which co-authored the controversial study on human sexuality commissioned by the Catholic Theological Society of America. The priests will offer different views on the subject of human sexuality.
