In GLIAC baseball battle

OU outslugs Ferris

Oakland University swept a doubleheader from Ferris State College last weekend and vaulted into first place in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference baseball race.

Mark Bielski paced the twin killing with a grand slam home run which provided Oakland with a 5-3 win in the first game. The Pioneers shut out the Bulldogs 3-0 in the nightcap.

Bielski's base-clearing hit highlighted a five-run Pioneers fifth inning, and erased an early 3-0 Ferris lead. Following a walk to Brian Cunningham in the seventh, outfielder Ed Vojtech capped the OU scoring with his third home run of the season.

Dave Jones yielded five runs in five innings, but was given the victory—his fifth against three losses. Tom Libby notched his second save of the season in pitching the final two innings.

OU's second game shut out was masterminded by Tim Seagraves. The OCC transfer had a two-hitter, striking out six and giving up two walks in going the full seven innings.

After scoring once in the second, OU took command when Jay Lentz cracked a two-run double in the third. Jim Dieters' two-run homer in the seventh gave him six this season.

The victories against the Bulldogs let Oakland two games better

than Grand Valley and Wayne State, which are tied for second place in the league with a 3-3 record.

Earlier in the week, Oakland bowed to Central Michigan, 5-1 and 11-0. The following day, Oakland split with Grand Valley in a pair of one-run losses.

The Pioneers fell 6-5 in the first game and were behind 3-0 after three innings in the second. OU never quit in the second game, however, and finally squeezed out a 9-8 victory in the last inning.

Seagraves was the winning pitcher. Following today's (Thursday) doubleheader at the University of Michigan, Oakland goes on the road for consecutive doubleheaders

at Northwood, Toledo, Detroit and Grand Valley before hosting Wayne State on April 30.

OU's TBNIS team seems to enjoy 'love.' At least that's how it looked when the Pioneers defeated Grand Valley and Olivet, 9-0 and beat Hillsdale, 8-1.

Oakland was beaten, however, Saturday by Kalamazoo College—the NCAA Division III's number three ranked team.

Now 14-2 overall and 3-1 in their league, Lee Frederick's team will play Albion this afternoon in its final home match of the year.

The short girls' softball season began in a flurry of games last week with Oakland compiling a 4-3 overall record, 0-2 in it league.

On April 10, Sharon Stickey shut out Grand Rapids Community College, 6-0. On Thursday against Olivet, the Pioneers won a doubleheader, 4-8 and 2-0. Winning pitchers were Mary Ann Reed and Brenda Tipton.

The Pioneers were blanked twice by Grand Valley, 9-0 and 4-0. Helen Shereda and Stickey were the losing pitchers.

OU concluded the week's games against Lake Michigan Saturday by splitting a doubleheader. Shereda lost the first game, 8-6, and Stickey was the winning pitcher in the second game, 12-1.
