The neighborhood has been rocked by protesters venting their anger against the Nazis and the police.

Inside sit three young Nazis and a large German shepherd named Brutus. Despite his forboding name, Brutus is a friendly dog, more inclined to innocent sniffing and licking than growling.

The three National Socialists seem to have neither the arrogance or viciousness people associate with Nazism.

seem to nave neuture na grogance my viciousness people associate with Nazism. Instead, all are polite. Mark, at age 25, is the oldest of the group. In the absence of organizer Bill Russell, he is in command. Minus the white-handled revolver, the German helmet, an Iron Cross dangling around his neck and his long, sandy-brown haar, he would be just another "lince boy" walking down the street. He works in Livonia and says his fathr would not approve of all that he is doing.

The last of the trio—he calls him-self Ken—has long blond hair beneath his helmet. His complexion is pale. His throat carries the marks of Sunday's fracas when one Brightmoor protester tried to choke him.

Ken is a soft-spoken, mild-man-nered 19-year-old. But he is zealous. His clothes speak louder than he

does.
His denim vest is adorned with a swastika and an Iron Cross. The words "White Power" are emblazoned across his back in metal

studs.

He speaks proudly of GermanPolish heritage—more of his German ancestry than his Polish,
though. He says he wants to visit

IN PRIVATE their voices are soft, but their advertising is tough. One sign in the storefront window says: "There's a place in Dachau for the Jews. Niggers welcome, or "Dachau was one in a series of Nazi extermination camps in Germany and eastern Europe. Approximately 11 million Jews and other interities did in the death camps during Nazis' 12-year reign in Germany.

In spile of the tough talk and terretactics advocated by some of their literature, Allen, Ken and Mark say they really don't advocate extermination.

## Malpractice counter suit wins appeal

The Physicians Crisis Committee is bailing as a major precedent a Michigan Court of Appeals decision allowing a Bloomfield Hills doctor to suctive Southfield attorneys for "malicious prosecution."
This is the first time we are aware of that this doctrine has been upheld," said Peter McCabe, co-chairman of the physicians group.
Dr. Seymour Friedman, a urologist, won the right to sue attorneys Peter Dozore and Robert H. Golden of Southfield. Oakland Grouth Judge Frederick Zeem had dismissed Priedman's suit without taking it to trial.
The attorneys had filled a medical majpractice suit against Dr. Friedman on behalf of a woman patient who diarter surgery because of an undetected darter surgery because of an undetected and the surgery because of an undetected and the surgery because of an undetected for the surgery because of the surge

Charles Farmer in Wayne Circuit Court.

Friedman counter-sued the attorneys, charging 1) malicious prosecution, 2) abuse of a legal process and 3) negligence. The appeals court upheld his right to sue on the first count but rejected the second two counts, according to Dr. McCabe.

The Physicians Crisis Committee applauded the decision in a news conference at the Detroit Press Club. The committee underworde Dr. Friedman's legal costs.
