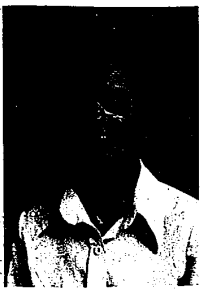


Henderson-Roberts

Honey Tree nursery takes fall enrollments

The Honey Tree Nursery School is now accepting enrollments for the coming fall term, but Geraldine Pugh, director of the school, urges mothers to observe the nursery in operation before signing up pre-schoolers.

"We want all of our mothers to be well aware of what we do here. We have a great many structured programs, and a lot of fun. It's a well-balanced program, but our emphasis is definitely on pre-reading skills and the parents should know this," she said.

The school is located in Incarnation Lutheran Church, at 30333 Ten Mile between Orchard Lake Road and Mid-diebt. Sessions are each three hours

long and run daily from 9 a.m. to noon and from 12:30-3:30 p.m.

Ms. Pugh is a graduate of Wayne State University who taught kindergarten for eight years in Livonia Public Schools before opening the Honey Tree in 1971.

She coordinates the curriculum for the daily operation of the school carried out by two certified teachers and one aide.

"OUR PURPOSE," she said, "is to introduce the child to social interaction with his peer group. So we expose the children to experiences

such as art, music, science, literature and cooking.

"But included in all these activities are readiness concepts which help to prepare the child for his beginning school years."

Parties are scheduled for all holidays. Parents are invited to the Christmas and Mother's Day parties when

the children provide the entertainment.

Field trips are scheduled once a month.

"We are licensed for 30 children," Ms. Pugh says, "but try to keep the class size down to give each child a more individualized learning experience."

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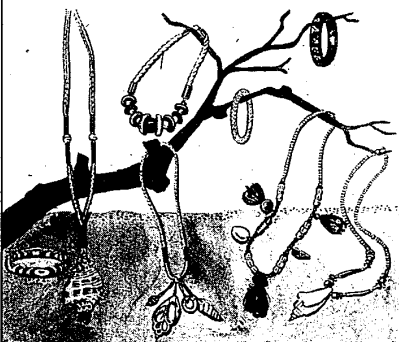
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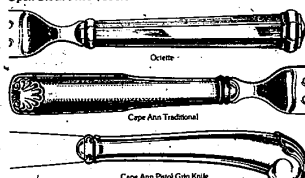
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
