Armenian dancers perform at Groves

The Vahagn, Armenian folk ensemble presentation, is scheduled for 8 p.m. June 3 at Groves High School in Birmingham. Leaping, twirling and whirling with rhythmic precision, the 35 members of the Armenian folk ensemble will dance their way onto the stage. Clad in \$100,000 worth of bright, ornate traditional costumes designed by William Terian, the dancers will perform Armenian, Arabic and Russian folk dances. Lebanese-born, Armenian dancer director and choreographer Hairabed Kazanian has rehearsed the dance group continually for the last nine months in preparation for the seventh annual Vahagn presentation. Specially composed orchestral music will be conducted by Ham-partoum Berberian and vocal renditions offered by New York mezzo soprano soloist Mara Partamian and Chicago baritone Sevanagh. The ethnic folk dancing program is open to the public. Ticket chairwoman is Mrs. M. Mutafian at 645-0997.

MARSHALL TUCKER Band, June 4 at 7:30 p.m.: Out of the hills of Kentucky four years ago came the Marshall Tucker Band and today they have earned a name as one of the hardest-working, crowd-pleasing bands on the road. Their newest record, "Together-Forever" is one of

their hottest sellers. Last year they sold-out at the Knob.

JEFFERSON Starship, June 5 and 6 at 7:30 p.m.: The music of Jefferson Starship is as unmistakable in the '70s

as was the sound of Jefferson Airplane in the '60s. The debut of the Starship in the fall of 1974 was the record "Dragonfly."

Their newest album is "Earth." It is their fourth recording venture. In

addition to Grace Slick, Paul Kantner and Marty Balin, the band members are Craig Chaquico (lead guitar), John Barata (drums) and Pete Sears and Dave Freiberg alternating on bass and keyboards.

McPartland opens jazz series

The Detroit Institute of Arts "Thursday Jazz at the Art Institute" summer series will open June 1, with pianist Marian McPartland.

Two performances will be given, at 7:30 and 9:30 p.m. in the museum's Kresge Court. Tickets may be obtained at the museum ticket office.

Esteemed as one of the top jazz musicians in the world, British-born McPartland has performed in the U.S. since 1945. Her recent credits include guest performances at festivals at Newport-New York, Monterey,

Detroit, Salt Lake City and Nice.

Her tour calendar has covered a series of concerts in South America with Earl Hines, Teddy Wilson and Ellis Larkins, as well as an extensive schedule of performances with John Lewis and Hank Jones in Japan.

FOLLOWING THE McPartland performances, the jazz series will continue every Thursday evening for 13 weeks through Aug. 31, offering a cross-section of jazz artists who make Detroit their home, blended with for-

mer Detroit musicians who have earned national reputations.

Included will be Thad Jones, Hal McKinney, Hank Jones, George Benson, Bessie Coleman, Barry Harris, Kenny Burrell, Roland Hanna, Charles McPherson and others.
