

# History comes alive at Greenmead 'Heritage Fair'

A mock war between Revolutionary and Civil War soldiers will highlight the "Heritage Fair" being sponsored by the Livonia Historical Society.

The fair will be on the spacious lawn at Greenmead, Livonia's historical site, on Sunday, June 4, from noon to 5 p.m.

The purpose of the fair, held in cooperation with the Livonia Historical Commission, is to raise money for the restoration of the DUR (Detroit Urban Railroad) building on the historical village site at Greenmead, on Eight Mile west of Newburgh.

In addition to the "war," there will be an antique auction, a bake sale, raffle of a handmade quilt done by members of the society, a country store featuring many handcrafted items by area artisans, a flea market and plant sale. Food and refreshments will be sold.

Craft demonstrations are planned, but there will be no sale of these items.

Tours of Hill House, the 12-room stately Greek Revival-style house that serves as Livonia's historical museum, will be offered. Admission will be \$1 for adults and 25 cents for children.

Meanwhile, members of the 1st Pennsylvania Regiment of the American Revolution (seen in the Memorial Day parade) and the 17th Michigan Volunteer Infantry, Company E of the Civil War are preparing for an overnight encampment Saturday in preparation for the mock battle Sunday.

Also taking part will be members of the Detroit Militia of the British Loyalists of former Fort Lenoir.

COMPANY E will have Civil War memorabilia on display.

Further old-time atmosphere will come in the presence of an authentic-looking chimney sweep in top hat and tails—black, of course. The sweep is Phil Glassman, a Livonia firefighter.

Churchill High School's junior class members will man a popcorn stand and sell balloons. Other mementoes will be available at a children's booth.

The antique auction will take place at 3 p.m. Items to be auctioned off will be on display in the Hill House before the auction.

City Councilman Jerry Raymond will be the auctioneer, with help from his wife, Rosina, who was recently elected president of the society.

police cadets will be available off Newburgh. In the event of rain, the fair will be held Sunday, June 11.

In a way, Sunday's fair will serve as Greenmead's spring debut to the public, culminating several weeks of intensive beautification of the grounds.

RECENTLY, 46 area Girl Scout and Cub Scout troops staged a massive "plant-in" in all areas of the 103-acre site. Each group brought a flat of flowers and planted them. This was in addition to the work done by six area garden clubs. Planned is a rose terrace to be located near the herb garden, directly south of Hill House.

Sunday's fair is being coordinated by Harriet Larson, immediate past president of the society. Her committee includes Helen Lord, Dorothy Lesner, Connie Wagenschutz, Sue Daniel, Florence Paden, Marian Lynch, Doris Pedus, Minerva Hill, Kenneth Koch, Chuck Wagenschutz and Nick Kladjan.
