"As it is, it's like reverse discrimi-hation. The more the voters approve locally, the less you get from the state."

SHE ALSO believes the laws regarding teacher-board contract disputes, including strikes, should be clarified. "There aren't too mray options available to teachers now," she says. "Binding arbitration is now illegal; they can go to fact-finding, but it's not binding. I really understand the plight of the teachers. As a board member,

you have to have legal groundwork, either enforce the laws or strike them."

She also backs teacher licensure, a bill before the Michigan legislature, in which teachers "police their own," she

which teachers 'police their own," she explains.
That might be one answer to the problems raised when teachers are pink-slipped because of enrollment eclines, she says. Getting rid of the 'worthless' classes mandated by colleges of education might be another step to improving teacher quality, she adds.

He believes greater accountability is required of teachers concerning their teaching methods. Parental involvement is one way to accomplish that goal, he said.

"I don't want parents to be intimidated. I want them to know they have the ear of the board."

HE ALSO believes a combination of greater emphasis on basic skills and minimal competency testing are ways to achieve better student and parent satisfaction with the schools.

He would like to see tests given in alternate years throughout elementary school and each year in high school. When the students have demonstrated basic competency in math and communication skills, they could opt for mroe classes, he says.

to take more classes in those areas?" he asks. "Somewhere we are not keeping the students' interest in the classroom. We have to motivate the students to want to learn."

Like many of the candidates, he believes declining enrollment is the district's most serious problem. One solution is to make better use of empty buildings, he says. With an interest in Proservation, he believes the district should hold on to the old Farmington High School, rather than sell it to a development firm which intends to demolish the structure.

If the structure is a proservation for high school students and make use of the building and carpentry skills of the students?" Let them restore that building to a useful purpose."


