Public hearings of the committee will be held in all parts of the state to discuss problems with local judges, officials, social workers, law enforcement agencies and all citizens.

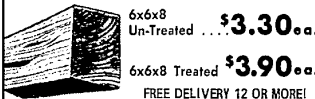

Kids Have Final Say On Naming New School

LIVONIA Naming Section 17 school which opened this fall will be both a school-wide and a community-wide project, with the children having the final say. According to custom, the new school will be named either after a deceased former president or a former secretary of state, possibly a one-time chief justice of the U.S. Supreme Court.

Choices of ex-presidents are dwindling. Only seven names are left: Martin Van Buren, James Polk, Zachary Taylor, Millard Fillmore, Franklin Pierce, Warren Harding and Chester A. Arthur. Harry Truman and Lyndon Johnson are disqualified because they still are living.

THERE ARE those who say that Taylor might become confused with the present Tyler School and Pierce with Pearson. Which leaves only Van

Buren, Polk, Fillmore, Harding and Arthur.

Principal Gene P. Ehrstun said a list of four names will be submitted to the children who then will research the personalities involved and their works and influence on the nation.

The pupils, led by their teachers, will read about the men and write reports. They will meet in both large and small groups for discussion and they will take the names home to involve their parents in the choice. Then the young people will cast the deciding vote for their new school's name.

"We want it to be a project in which the community joins and takes an interest, too," Ehrstun said. "After all, the school belongs to the community and we want them to feel a part of it."

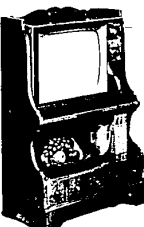

In the Macomb County townships of Chesterfield, Macomb and Shelby, success is fair, pressure is moderate, and the foliage is heavy.

"A few" squirrels were taken in the Algonac State Park and St. John's marsh.

Although Wayne County hunters have had poor luck with squirrels, they report seeing

good numbers of pheasants. The Detroit River and some spots in Lake St. Clair are

yielding good perch catches, but muskie and walleye success is generally meager.

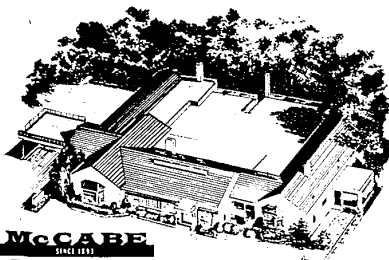
Square Dance Club Formed
