Livonia mayor eyed as SEMTA chairman

In a note of political irony, Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara is on his way to becoming chairman of the board of the seven-county Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

McNamara was tapped by the board's nominating committee to succeed Thomas F. Turner, a Detroit representative and president of the metropolitan AFL-CIO.

The irony is that McNamara was once removed as a member of the Detroit Water and Sewer Board by Mayor Coleman A. Young, who resented the way the suburbanite probed into water board operations.

A further irony is that McNamara is leap-frogging over the head of Dwight Havens, currently first vice-chairman and the man in line to succeed Turner. Havens, of Grosse Pointe, is head of the Greater Detroit Board of Com-

merce and tends to hold Young's points of view on rapid transit needs.

McNamara was tapped for chairman over Havens last week in a secret ballot 4-1 vote of the nominating committee. In order to present a united front, the nominating committee issued a unanimous report.

Election of the chairman will take place in July.

McNamara has been on the SEMTA board one year. He was appointed by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

The SEMTA board has 15 members—five from Detroit (picked by Young), three from the Wayne County suburbs, three from Oakland County, two from Macomb and two from the outlying counties picked by the governor.

The current board is considered to have an 8-7 pro-Detroit balance.

College's top job draws huge field of hopefuls

More than 100 candidates are expected to apply to become the new president of the multi-campus Oakland Community College (OCC).

At least 97 persons have already submitted applications to succeed the late Joseph Hill, who was OCC's president for a decade. Filing deadline is June 15.

Interim President Derek Nunney, who had served as vice-president for academic affairs under Hill, has not applied, said members of the college's 20-member presidential search committee. Nunney has said he will not apply for the position, but members of the search committee have said they

expect him to be nominated.

The presidential search committee, which has only met once, has scheduled another meeting June 20 to review the applications and nominations.

The advisor to the search committee, Sigurd Rislov, said the initial field of candidates will be narrowed to 15 or 20 names. Those names, he said, will be submitted to the college's board of trustees which will ultimately decide who will succeed Hill.

Rislov, a professor of education at Wayne State University, said the board had no formal deadline to meet in hiring the new president.
