Newcomer leads in runoff

There will be a new face on the Oakland Community College Board of Trustees.

Sandra L. Ritter, 31, of Waterford Township, outpolling seven other candidates, including two incumbents, to win a six-year term Monday. Her unofficial vote total was 11,593.

The race for the second board seat, however, was too close to call. Incumbent Dennis Rogers of Troy leads the other incumbent, Lila Johnson, a 14-year veteran from Huntington Woods, by two votes, 10,185 to 10,183.

Results will not be official until June 20 at the latest, according to the chairperson of the Oakland County Board of Canvassers Antoinette C. McCarthy.

The canvassers, she said, are going over the results in each precinct of the 97 school districts in the college's area.

ANOTHER CANDIDATE, Mary Pamela Ryan of Birmingham, who publicly said she had withdrawn from the race but never filed the necessary

papers making it official, finished a strong fourth with 9,566. She was among the leaders throughout the night.

Late Monday night, though, Mrs. Ryan sent a handwritten letter to the board of trustees saying she would not serve if elected.

Here is a listing of the unofficial vote totals for the other candidates: Robert Newton of Orchard Lake, 9,172; Marilyn Levinson of West Bloomfield, 7,583; Peter V. Tenuta of Pontiac, 7,214; and John Bowker of Bloomfield Hills, 4,359.

The election results must be validated by the Oakland County Board of Canvassers. The candidates will have six days following certification of the results by the canvassers to file a request for a recount.

FOR MRS. RITTER, the election results were "overwhelming, gratifying and exciting."

The Detroit Public School teacher attributed her victory to the endorsement of OCC's faculty association. She said the teachers' endorsement was important to her. "It gave me a thread of hope," she said.

The faculty association also endorsed Rogers.

Rogers, however, faced organized opposition from a reportedly administration-backed ticket of Mrs. Johnson and Newton.

According to published reports and statements made by OCC administrators and trustees, Interim President Derek Nunney was trying to unseat Rogers, who had opposed a number of his proposals.
