New Pendleton lines still add up to good looks for men

Add a touch of youthfulness and western styling to the classic looks of Pendleton and you'll capture the mood of the Pendleton man for fall.

Traditionally a leader in good looks, Pendleton, the trademark for Pendleton Woolen Mills in Portland, Ore., introduced a new line of styling to go with its two new lines brought out last fall.

Country Traditionals is the company's baby. It has clothes with classic lines that are for the young at heart, according to Robert E. Cena, Pendleton's men's wear merchandising manager.

Offering an English approach to men's clothes, Country Traditionals are tailored separates that include sport jackets, slacks and vests of tartans and plaids, herringbones and Shetland hopsacking. To accompany the English looking jackets that sport bellow pockets and suede elbow patches, Pendleton has woven vests and sweater vests, and the English necessities—mufflers, caps and tweed hats. These all are, of course, in the popular Pendleton virgin wool.

But for those who want a more

down-home look, Pendleton is repeating its two lines from last September, Lobo and Western.

LOBO is a crossover from the Pendleton label, which means the garment is 100 per cent virgin wool, and the PenWest label for all non-wool items. While Lobo sweaters are all wool, they'll have the Lobo by Pendleton label, but slacks in the same line, which are a blend of cotton and polyester, will have a Lobo by PenWest tag inside.

The sweaters represent the more youthful style for men with their convertible collars that zip into turtle-necks or even hoods.

"There are distinctive shirt patterns offered in the Lobo line only, plus outdoor and outerwear coats in wool, some with suede gunpatches," said Cena.

For the man who likes the chilly outdoors, Lobo has a reversible outdoor vest with a shell of navy, camel or red Melton and a wool curl lining. If that's not warm enough for Michigan mid-winter weather, he can top the vest with Lobo wool coats that have hoods



and vivid wool plaid linings to match the ever-popular wool plaid Pendleton shirts.

Living up to the made-in-America reputation, Pendleton's Western line displays its attraction to Indian patterns. These are used in the Western coats that include an all-wool fleece collared outer coat and three new Indian patterns in color combinations based on navy, gray or brown. Sweaters, vests and pillows also will be decorated in the Indian patterns.

"There are dressier items, too, such as jackets in herringbones and mini checks featuring Western detailing. We also have Western pants and shirts with yolk detailing and pearl-stitch buttons," Cena added.

If one can think about purchasing fall and winter clothes already, these three lines, as well as the traditional

classic looks, already are on the store racks. But before you buy a Pendleton product, make sure it's one you really like. A piece of clothing with a Pendleton label lasts only until the wearer gets tired of it.

It's a corker

Working on the tension principle, the two prongs grip the cork on the outside so that the cork comes out clean and in one piece. The wine corker will also recork the bottle. Another nice thing: the corker fits into a handsome black acrylic case complete with the block initial of your choice done in stainless steel. Then the whole kit and kaboodle fits into a cotton suede bag. Orders take two to three weeks.
