Chinese parade goes on exhibit


A Chinese parade, consisting of more than 100 figurines 1 1/2-inches high is one of the many items featured in a special Oriental exhibit in the Plymouth Historical Museum. The exhibit will be on display through Aug. 20.

The museum, located at 155 S. Main, is open Thursday, Saturday and Sunday from 14 p.m. Admission is \$1 for adults; 50 cents for those 12-17 and 25 cents for children.

Special education tours may be arranged in advance by calling the museum at 455-8940.

Included in the exhibit is a collection of soapstone carvings, cinnamon red boxes, ebony statues, cloisonne items, rose medallion dishes, and a "vase of 100 faces."

Some of the pieces loaned to the museum for the exhibit are bronze statues, an enameled plate of 100 butterflies, Chinese and Japanese children's toys, Chinese and Japanese kimonos, parasols, and many dishes from Japan, dating before 1890.
