DURING 1977, in Farmington Hills about 10 per cent of the 99 reports of aggravated assault (physical attacks with weapons or a great deal of bodily force) involved husbands and wives. Simple assaults, including assault and battery, totaled 221, 18 or eight per cent of which involved spouses. Statis-

tics collected this year reflect the same percentages, Niemisto says. In the City of Farmington, about one per cent of the total runs involve-spouse abuse, although a larger percentage are concerned with family trouble, Byrnes says. Very often neighbors or children of the couple call

Some of those cases involve repeaters, he adds; which is one reason why criticism of police involvement in spouse abuse cases is harsh, he explains.

But he also understands why spouses

But he also understands why spouses fear signing a complaint.

"If she could get out, she wouldn't be calling us in the first place," he says. Religion, children, and very often the spouses' parents pressure the abused spouse to stay. Particularly when the battering spouse is a "good provider." the abused spouse faces tremendouse pressure to stick with it, Byrnes says.

"We know it's a problem, and it's a damn big problem. Ask any cop. But what can be done?"
