

NFWB baseball league now in mid-season

The North Farmington West Bloomfield Baseball For Youth Federal Major League Rangers beat the Orioles 10-8. Although they had played some excellent baseball this season, the Rangers had been unable to pull out a victory until the June 26 game. Nick Murrucio and Kelly Haas each had two hits in a losing cause for the Orioles.
