

Polish poster exhibit planned

A colorful collection of original Polish posters brought back from Poland by Detroit art historian Danuta A. Boczar will be on view July 13 through Aug. 26 in the exhibit hall of the main Detroit Public Library.

Ms. Boczar will give an illustrated slide lecture, "The Contemporary Polish Poster," at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, July 19, in the Friends Auditorium at the Main Library. The lecture will be followed by an informal recep-

tion with refreshments in the exhibit area. Admission is free.

The exhibit and program are co-sponsored by the Detroit Public Library and the Friends of Polish Art.

Ms. Boczar assembled her collection of posters while on a Fulbright-Hays Research Fellowship at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, Poland, in 1975-77.

A native Detroit, she attended Cass Technical High School and Wayne State University here, then

received a masters in art history with museum training at the George Washington University in Washington, D.C. While in Poland, she also lectured on American art and worked with the American embassy in Warsaw on touring American art exhibits.

According to Ms. Boczar, the Polish poster is one of the strong innovative art forms of the past 15-20 years, because of its colorful and attractive format, strong advertising presence and high aesthetic quality.

In contrast to the limited function of posters in the U.S., posters in Poland are seen constantly on busy city streets, on kiosks, fences, corner "poster stands," and the like. The only poster museum in the world is in Warsaw.

The Polish poster exhibit at the main library may be viewed during the library's open hours, Monday-Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., except Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.
