3 Named For Charity Awards

For the 16th year, three outstanding area businessmen will be added to the unique roster of the "Knights of Charity."

St. Paul's Church Library Celebrates Five Years

"Thank God for Books" is the theme of fifth anniversary celebration of the library of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Farmington.

The library was organized under the direction of St. Paul's Women's Missionary League with the Mary Martha Circle being responsible for maintenance.

Mrs. Donald French was librarian for the first two years, while Mrs. Orville Hittinger has been in that post for the past three years. The library is staffed before and after church services by members of the circle, which also prepares the books for circulation.

Today there are more than 700 volumes in the library collection, with the yearly circulation figures set at 600. The library is supported by the Women's Missionary League and individual gifts and memorials.

St. Paul's Pastor Walker Rutkowski has donated an entire set of Luther's works to the collection. No member of the library committee has any formal

training in library science, but all of the books on the shelves have been classified according to a modified Dewey Decimal system.

To observe the anniversary the committee has made 1,500 bookmarks. These will be distributed at the church services and Sunday School Oct. 19. On

Oct. 12, Pastor Rutkowski will distribute miniature scrolls to the children attending the "Children's Sermon" during the worship services.
