Recent laws passed in the Michigan legislature have expanded police arrest powers in domestic situations and also make lighter demands on police to report such violence.

A five-bill package was signed into law last week which Bannon says will serve as a model for other states to follow.

Police contend that domestic violence cases are one of the most frequent crimes they have to deal with, with surveys claiming that up to 34 per cent of American families may be experiencing spouse abuse.

Governor Milliken asked for funds last spring to set up a Detroit shelter for battered wives and their children and now the Women's Liberation Coalition's graphic plea will cry out for a shelter from billboards scattered in the area.

Barbara Troy and others like her hope the cries will be heard.
