After witnessing the demonstration of applying lane finish under the new rules adopted by the American Bowling Congress the bowling proprietors of Michigan, assembled in annual convention, wholeheartedly endorsed the change.

Under the new rule the lane finish can be built up in the center and curve

toward both gutters. This was done because the finish now employed wears off after 15 games and is completely gone at the end of 30 games.

"If the new code does what the ABC officials claim it will there will be less kicking from the bowlers. This is especially true of those who bowl in the

low leagues," George Bashara, of Waterland Lanes, commented.

"Under the old code of a flat surface from gutter to gutter, the bowlers had more lanes most of the time in their closing games. Now, there'll be enough finish still left to keep the complainers quiet."

A SURVEY of the establishments that cater to the all-star leagues revealed that there are few openings. Both of the Bonanza loops that bowl at Thunderbolt on Tuesdays and Orchard Lanes on Thursdays are filled.

The Waterland Classic, rated right behind the all-star circuits, also is

filled. The same is true of the mixed league at Westland Bowl.

It is in the leagues just below the all-star that there are openings. Waterland is short three teams in the senior league and many others are in the same fix. All expect to be filled by the time the season opens.

THERE was some unusual bowling at Merril-Bowl during the past week.

In the Tuesday men's league Doug Oliver turned in a 164 triplicate and Joe Thompson had an all spare game of 184. At the same time Tom Estrano and Bob Grunder each turned in his first 600 series in 20 years of bowling. Estrano had a 603 and Grunder a 620m.

While these unusual things were happening Dan Ottman put together games of 245, 213 and 257 for 715.

In in the Wednesday Wake Up league Carol had a 277 in 585, Lory Gorski had a 215 for high game and Claudia O'Hara had a 567.

AT WOODLAND LANES Bob Newbrough, who carries an average of 187, stole the show in the Spring Mixed League. He opened with 232, followed with 181, 238 and 246 for a 917 series.

THE LADIES OF THE EVENING had a great time knocking over the pins at Westland Bowl.

Louise Robinson set the pace in class A with a 223 in 566 and Sue Marsella had high game in Class B with a 225 in 543.

In the Thursday morning Confusion league Joanne Manke was high with a 225 in 556.

SOME FANCY PIN SPILLING was turned in at Bel-Aire Lanes with Tony De Podesta turning a 672 for high series of the week. He linked games of 226, 237 and 269 for top honors in the Thursday league.

Mike Walter was not far behind with a 644 in the Guys and Dolls, and Dennis Howder had a 620 on games of 233, 203 and 184.

Alto Valentinai paced the Men's Trio with 253 and Renate Piper was high in the Queens League with a 243.

PGA ticket prices announced

Tickets are now available for the 1979 PGA Championship, which will be held at Oakland Hills Country Club in Birmingham.

Bill Prew, the general manager for the 61st PGA, and Mark Cox, executive

director of the PGA, announced the ticket prices last week during a press conference at the club.

"We hope to have the finest PGA ever," Prew said. "We have a great golf club and a great membership."

Cox agreed that Oakland Hills is among the best golf courses in the country.

Oakland Hills holds the record for the most revenue produced by any PGA golf tournament, Cox said. The club netted \$200,000 after the 1972 championship.

Season tickets are available for grounds only and for clubhouse and grounds. Exchangeable coupon books are also available in two categories. Ticket purchasers who order before Jan. 1, will be eligible for special prices in all categories.

Following is a breakdown on the prices of the various tickets:

- Season Tickets (grounds only): includes a daily ticket for each day of the tournament, a coupon for a copy of the tournament annual, and free parking. Price is \$60 before Jan. 1, \$70 before April 1, and \$75 after April 1.
- Season tickets (clubhouse and grounds): includes a daily ticket for each day of the tournament, a coupon for a copy of the tournament annual, and free parking. Price is \$80 before Jan. 1, \$90 before April 1, and \$100 after April 1.

• Coupon books (grounds only): includes 10 coupons good for any day of the tournament, with parking and 10 copies of the tournament annual. Price is \$115 before Jan. 1, \$125 before April 1, and \$135 after April 1.

• Coupon books (clubhouse and grounds): includes 10 coupons good for clubhouse, free parking and 10 copies of the tournament annual. Price is \$160 before Jan. 1, \$170 before April 1, and \$180 after April 1.

Daily tickets for the tournament are scaled at \$10 for practice days (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, July 20 through Aug. 1) and \$15 each for four regular tournament days. All prices include parking and a copy of the tournament annual if the ticket is purchased in advance.

The City of Farmington Hills Planning Commission will give formal consideration to a Proposed Amendment (Rezoning Request No. 23-6-78) which would rezone part of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 18, City of Farmington Hills, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, being more particularly described as:

Part of the northeast 1/4 of Section 18, town 1 north, range 9 east, beginning at the east 1/4 corner thence south 89 degrees 35 minutes west 1706.20 feet, thence along curve to left radius 4703.80 feet of bears north 48 degrees 29 minutes 20 seconds west 1246.30 feet distance 1250 feet thence north 0 degrees 3 minutes east 178.80 feet thence east 1836.15 feet thence south 465 feet, that part taken for highways M 102 and I 86 interchange, 40.5 Acres.

This property lies on the West side of Halsted Road, between 10 and 11 Mile Roads.

The above-mentioned request would rezone the above-mentioned property from its present RA-2, One-Family Residential District classification, to RC3, Multiple-Family Residential District classification, or LI-1, Light Industrial District classification.
